Contact Lens Services

Thank you for trusting us with your eye care needs. In order to maintain optimal health, comfort, and vision, we require all of our contact lens patients to have a comprehensive eye examination and a contact lens fitting evaluation every year.

The contact lens fitting evaluation includes determination of your contact lens prescription, measurements of the shape and power of your cornea, assessment of the contact lens on your eye, and examination of physiological changes due to contact lens wear. These findings will determine if changes in the power, material, wear time, or lens care of your contact lenses are necessary.

Your initial contact lens fitting in our office includes trials and/or ordering of contact lenses and may require multiple visits in order to achieve the best comfort and vision. The cost of these follow-up visits is included in the contact lens fitting fee for a period of 3 months. Your contact lens prescription is good for one year. A maintenance exam will be performed yearly to renew your contact lens prescription.

There are conditions that can be elicited with contact lens wear including: eye infections, corneal ulcers, severe allergies, and dry eyes. Although corneal infections are rare, severe cases can lead to *loss of vision and even blindness*. Abusing your contacts by over wear, not adhering to the replacement schedule, and improper lens care and hygiene may increase your risk for these conditions. All contact lens wearers should have a pair of back-up glasses. Contact lens prescriptions are good for one year.
